This is an exciting opportunity to join our small and busy team and support our growing work right across the Wairarapa region in a new role as the Wairarapa Moana - Freshwater Coordinator.

About the role

In this role you will be responsible for planning, managing and delivering our handson Whitebait Connection school education programs, event engagement, and community support for freshwater restoration and scientific monitoring in the Wairarapa Moana region.

This will involve working with a wide range of stakeholder and community partners, from a variety of backgrounds, cultures and age groups, to build effective working relationships and achieve meaningful action for freshwater biodiversity.

You'll work with and be supported by our Regional Freshwater Manager and other members of our team. You'll also play a key role in managing volunteers, contractors and members of the public and building strong relationships with our partners in the region.

You will be responsible for managing health and safety for education and events, leading communications on Wairarapa freshwater projects, applying for funds to support the ongoing role and maintaining systems to support tracking of project budgets and reporting.

Training in the delivery of our education and science-based training programs will be provided in the role, and through attendance at our annual Mountains to Sea Conservation Trust Wānanga in 2021

What we are looking for

- Experience working with and for young people and able to relate to students from all walks of life, ages and stages. Teaching experience an advantage.
- A sensitivity and committment to Te Tiriti o Waitiangi
- Ability to work in true partnership with hapu, iwi and community stakeholders, understanding their aspirations, to sustain and grow conservation
- Excellent communication, data management and reporting skills
- Team focus with ability to self-motivate and work independently
- Project management skills and experience
- Able to connect and work with a wide variety of people
- Fit and resilient. Our job is often hot, cold, wet & windy. We work far and wide, especially during summer.
- Hold NZ citizenship or permanent residency
- Hold a full driver's license and a vehicle suitable for field work.

- Organised, self-starter, manages varied workload cheerfully and effectively
- Professional, constructive, problem solver, able to work with others.
- Fluency in te reo māori or a commitment to working towards this goal would be a great asset
- Skills in fund-raising, communications, photography, websites, promotions would also make a great contribution to our team.

Timing

Location: The role will be based in the Wairarapa, and also require approximately 2-3 days a month at our current base at The Settlement in Porirua. The role will involve a lot of travel within the Wairarapa region. At this stage this vehicle must be supplied by the applicant, with a view to finding funding for a vehicle once in the role.

Salary: Our anticipated salary range for the 0.5 FTE role is \$26,000 - \$35,000, plus expenses, depending on the level of skill and experience you bring to the role.
